I was deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Fredric G. Levin and extend my deepest and sincerest condolences to the friends and family who knew and loved him.

Fredric was a pioneer for law in this country. His career as a trial attorney led him to earning the "Perry Nichols Award", being named the top civil litigator in Florida by the National Law Journal, receiving honor at the United Nations as a Chief of the Republic of Ghana and recognition from the United States Congressional Black Caucus, and being inducted into the Trial Lawyer Hall of Fame by the American Trial Lawyers Association. As an alumni of University of Florida's College of Law in 1961, he contributed financially to the university, and was ultimately honored by the university naming the Levin College of Law after him.

Fred will be missed by his friend Phillip Morris, daughter Marci Levin Goodman, son-in-law Judge Ross Goodman, son Martin Levin, grandson Brenton Goodman and sister-in-law Teri Levin.

Though his presence will be truly missed, Fred's memory will live on through the people he influenced and the family he deeply loved.
